

The school we revere as our alma mater had its modest beginning on October 8, 1908, on the second floor of the Imbusch Building on 3rd Avenue, East. Then known as Cullman County High School, it had an enrollment of 45. Class of 1912, the first to graduate, had only six pupils.






Five acres donated by George W. Parker and C. A. Stiefelmeyer was the site of a new school. In 1949, the high school was transferred to the Cullman City School System.

When the new plant was completed in 1962, the junior high grades became a separate school occupying the old campus. The school presently has an enrollment of about 950—almost a thousand young people who can be proud of a school with such a fine past and promising future.









Cullman's consistent offense rolled up 3,104 total yards averaging 310.4 yards per game, while the rugged defense allowed the opposition only 163.2 yards per game. Halfback Mike Cobb led the team in scoring, with 86 points, and rushing, with a 6.34 average. Senior quarterback Butch Morton was the total offense leader with 1,005 yards passing and 184 yards rushing.
























