## Faculty


These students were selected by faculty members because of their ability to excel in these categories.

SCHOLASTIC: These students should show high scholastic ability and be able to use it in practical situations.



## Students Receive Honors




Kim Dennis was selected as an instructor for the Universal Cheerleaders Association. She will teach cheerleading at various clinics in the Southeastern United States.


