












WARNING
































Notes on FOCUS


The Game






Girls' State and Boys' State each consist of a week of mock government sponsored by the American Legion. Two boys and one girl from every school in the state are selected by submitting an essay to their principal, which is then evaluated by a committee of selected faculty. The girls spend their week at Huntingdon College campaigning for anything from city council to governor. The boys reside at Samford University where they listen to prominent speakers such as Governor Hunt and Lieutenant Governor Folsom.

During the week the participants visited the state capital and were present at a Supreme Court ruling. The week ended with an inauguration ceremony which installed the newly elected Girls' State and Boys' State officers.

National Merit Scholars



The National Merit Scholarship Program is a yearly competition in which more than 50,000 scholastically talented high school students are identified and honored. Approximately 35,000 Commended Students will be named on the basis of a nationally applied Selection Index Score, which is usually above the ninety-fifth percentile of college-bound juniors. Some 15,000 of the highest scorers will qualify as Semifinalists, and they will have the opportunity to become a Finalist. About 6,500 Merit Scholarships worth approximately \$25 million will be awarded to these exceptional students.






















Fair Representative Contestants

Cook has been successful in both endeavors and will be greatly missed by the program.

Another individual who retired after the 1992 football cam-






OVERVIEW
