Two boys and one girl from every school in the state are selected by submitting an essay to their principal, which is then evaluated by a committee of selected faculty. The girls spend their week at Huntingdon College campaigning for anything from city council to governor. The boys reside at Samford University where they listen to prominent speakers such as Governor Hunt and Lieutenant Governor Folsom.

The National Merit Scholarship Program is a yearly competition in which more than 50,000 scholastically talented high school students are identified and honored. Approximately 35,000 Commended Students will be named on the basis of a nationally applied Selection Index Score, which is usually above the ninety-fifth percentile of college-bound juniors. About 6,500 Merit Scholarships worth approximately $\$ 25$ million will be awarded to these exceptional students.

An era came to an end when the Cullman/Albertville game was over. Head Coach Dale Cook stepped down from the helm of the mighty ship he had guided for nine years, a span only outlived by one other, Coach Oliver Woodard. Cook left the field as the second winningest coach in the history of Cullman football with a record of 57 wins and 39 losses. That is a .746 winning percentage. When asked what he would miss most about coaching, Cook replied "I will miss getting to be part of the kids."
Coaching and "kids" have been part of Cook's life for the past thirty years. Cook recalls the
past season as being "a lot of fun till we ran out of gas." Football is a fun game, but it also teaches some important fundamentals that will last a lifetime. "Nothing is easy, and you don't ever get anything for free," was Cook's reply when asked what he felt football instilled into individuals most. Throughout his nine year reign as head coach, Cook strived to improve the program and to help players make important decisions concerning their careers. Cook has been successful in both endeavors and will be greatly missed by the program.
Another individual who retired after the 1992 football cam-
paign was Assistant Coach Don Wilbanks. Wilbanks had been coaching football since 1976. "I guess my favorite part of coaching is being able to see what you teach be demonstrated on the field," said Wilbanks. The past two years have been perfect examples of execution. When everyone does his job, good things will happen. Wilbanks emphasizes that good things do not always take place: "Sometimes your best isn't good enough, and that's just part of growing up." It was evident that Wilbanks cared for the "kids" that played, and they respected him for it.

## OVERVIEW

It was a season of ups and downs, but the ups greatly outweighed the downs. At one point in the season, Cullman was ranked number two in class 5-A for the entire state. The high school and the city were honored by this illustrious ranking. Cullman seemed to be on top of the world until injuries began to plague the squad. Two starters were lost, and two weeks later the team would fall to the Hartselle Tigers. This was the beginning of three weeks of frustration. The Bearcats were always just inches or seconds away from pulling a victory out of the tightly grasped hands of defeat.

No matter what anyone says, it does take a slight amount of luck to win a football game. On one given night, anyone can be thrown for a loss. Yet, what makes one a winner? An undying desire to excel, to compete, to succeed makes one a winner. This characterizes the 1992 squad perfectly. A championship ring was not in the plan, even though everyone strived so hard for it. Victory and defeat will give us memories that we can look back upon for a lifetime. Area champions will always go hand in hand with the year 1992. We will never forget the closing two games of the season when the players came together to lay a single heart on the line. This was the team's season, not any one individuals' season. Statistics may be forgotten, but the memories that this unit has shared will live on forever.
