

The Homecoming float judging committee, made up of local citizens, appraise the class floats. The Senior Class float, "Behead Bulldogs," took first place.




English

Five teachers teach general science, biology, advanced biology, chemistry and physics.





Courses in Typing I and II, Shorthand I and II, business law and business math are offered to those going into the business field.





Art


A lot of color was added with the new art classes.




Agriculture




CHS offers a wide and appealing selection of courses. How are they chosen? Those planning to work take business courses, while those anticipating college take academic courses.

Who are these students? You . . . your acquaintances . . . your closest friends. Here it all is—classes, studies, a year in motion.








































