# FACULTY SELECTIONS OF TEN AND POTENTIAL



Junior class vice-president, Ivan Richard leads active life on the CHS playing fields. Among his interests are football, baseball, and basketball.




# OUTSTANDING STUDENTS IN ACHIEVEMENT
















