

PICTURES OF YOU

Any article of clothing or manner of style or make-up determined to be disruptive of the learning environment, or hazardous to the health and safety of the student or teacher will not be allowed.




The following guidelines should be considered in purchasing clothes for school:


1. Shorts, halters, tank shirts, undergarments worn as outer garments, see-through shirts and blouses, or any other clothing which is determined to be too revealing, suggestive, disruptive, or in poor taste will not be worn at school.
2. Any garment (dress, skirt, shorts, skorts, etc.) must extend below the fingertips when a student stands with their arms at their side. (The garment must be worn as designed.)
3. Shirts and blouses must meet pants or skirts. No midriffs showing.
4. Clothing which advertises alcohol or drugs, or with writing, pictures, or patches which are vulgar, suggestive, or in poor taste will not be allowed.
5. Students will be required to wear shoes.
6. Students will not wear any type headdress to school.
7. Students will not wear sunglasses inside the buildings.
8. Jeans or pants with large holes above the knee will not be worn.









NATIONAL Drama Class SOCIETY



Leo Club



BRING IT ON HOME


